

California SD 24 Race: Survey Memo
 Survey Conducted May 27-28, 2026



A new survey conducted on May 27th and 28th, 2026 by Gudelunas Strategies of 425 likely primary voters shows Brian Goldsmith with a lead in the primary race for California State Senate District 24. Goldsmith gained 14 points since a similar survey conducted from April 15th to 19th. Goldsmith leads by 9 points over the closest Democratic candidates.

- ⇒ **Brian Goldsmith has moved into first place, with a two-point lead over the closest Republican, Kristina Irwin, and a 9-point lead over the closest Democrats, John Erickson and Sion Roy.**
- ⇒ **Compared to a similar poll conducted with the same methodology from April 15th to 19th, Goldsmith has gained 14 points, while John Erickson has gained five points and Sion Roy has gained three.**

- ⇒ **Brian Goldsmith also leads the race among those who have already voted. Almost one-third (32%) of the electorate reports that they have cast their vote already and Goldsmith leads the closest Democrat, Sion Roy, by 5 points.**

Methodology

GS conducted 425 interviews with likely California State Senate District 24 primary voters using mixed modes of voter contact, including telephone, text-to-web, and email. Respondents were likely June 2026 voters. The margin of the sampling error is ±4.75%. The survey was conducted on behalf of Progressive Leadership for Us, Brian Goldsmith for State Senate 2026.
